## Sunday Thought

Anne Walsh, a spiritual writer, commented on today's Gospel in this fashion, "Waiting is never easy, and yet, the experience of waiting is integral to human lives. We wait for important phone calls. We eagerly anticipate the visits of dear friends and family members. We wait anxiously for the results of tests and exams. As technology advances, we become frustrated at even short delays. Woven into the gospel today is a reminder that all things take time, and that with all our technological advancements there are things over which we have no control. God gives the growth. A seed will always take the necessary time to germinate, grow, and yield. We can tend and water the seed with great care. We can visit the garden every day. But we cannot make the seed grow only God can do that. And so, we are called to cultivate an attitude of patience. Woven more deeply into the gospel today is a call to wonder and awe. How is it that "the smallest of all seeds on the earth," can grow to become "the largest of plants?" For all of our knowledge, we do not know the answer to this. We can only respond to God's activity with wonder and awe. What seed has God planted within us? What signs of growth can we see within and around us? God is at work within and around us. Let us be patient."
