



# Love Without Measure...

" A Christian world and a world yet to be evangelized." That situation no longer exists. The people who have not heard the gospel no longer live in non-western countries. They are everywhere especially in large urban areas. In large cities new models are needed. We are not in Christian times." Pope Francis

In his Apostolic Exhortation, Evangelii Nuntiandi, Pope Paul VI speaks specifically of the evangelizing mission of migrants. Take a Christian or a handful of Christians who, in the midst of their community, how their capacity for understanding and acceptance, their sharing of life and destiny with other people, and their solidarity with the efforts of all for whatever is noble and good.

Let us suppose the, in addition, they radiate in an altogether simple and unaffected way their faith in values that go beyond current and popular values, and their hope is not seen and that one would not dare to imagine. Through this wordless witness, these Christians stir irresistible questions in the hearts of those who see how they live: why are they like this? Why do they live this way? Why or whom inspires them? Why are they among us? Such a witness is already a silent proclamation of the good news and a very powerful and effective one. Here we have an initial act of evangelization.

Poppe Paul VI introduced a new era of mission linked to the energy of the times, urbanization, and linked local and international migration. As in the past, mission went with human movement. Pope Paul recognized the emergence of a new human energy: migration.


It is the same way. Coming from today's underdeveloped, incoherent world and seeing skylines of the rich world, they are saying what immigrants said to themselves in the past; if I can make it there, I can make it anywhere. Immigrants are the energy band in today's world. They energize economies at home with their remittances and away with their energy and ingenuity. Their arrival energizes local Christian communities, mosques and temples. They are the new forces of evangelization, the new messengers to the new ad gentes.


Mission today is related to issues. Building issues, solidarity, and resolving tensions. Mission today is beyond geography. Migration is the human heart on a journey of hope. Hope is the dynamic force in a pandemic-ridden world.

Authentic mission must be asking: who are the excluded? Who is denied contributive justice? The severest poverty is that of not being wanted. Mission is now about encounter, welcoming and witness expressed in a wide range of new informal participatory ministries, challenging dehumanizing secular liberalism in which the market is God, profit is sanctifying grace, heaven is homeowner occupied, to be poor is to be damned and excluded.

"The Church is called to remind everyone that for God no one is a foreigner, or excluded. It is called to awaken consciences dormant to indifference to the reality of migrants." (Pope Francis)

# Reflection

## "Friend, Lend me your hands"

During the wind-swept city bridge War, a small Korean village came under heavy artillery fire. When the smoke of the battle cleared away, the pastor of the parish sought the help of some American soldiers in restoring to its pedestal a fallen statue of Christ. Since the statue's hands were gone, the soldiers planned to mold two new hands. The pastor, however, came up with a very meaningful suggestion: "Let us leave the statue as it is and write on the front of the pedestal the words, "Friend, lend me your hands." Sending his apostles as his ambassadors to preach the "Good News" and to heal the sick, Jesus, in today' Gospel, reminds us that he has no hands but ours to raise the fallen; no feet but ours to seek out the lost; no ears but ours to listen to the lonely; and no tongue but ours to speak words of sympathy and encouragement to those weighed down by sorrow, pain and failure.

We become fully alive as Christians through the generous giving of ourselves. What is more important than sending checks for charitable causes is giving of ourselves to people: in the way we speak to them and about them, in the way we forgive their failings, in the way we encourage them, console them and help them, and even in the way we think about them. These types of generosity reflect warmth radiating from the very love of God.






The Cleveland Catholic Deaf Center invites you to a special 5:30 PM Mass on Saturday, July 27, 2024.
