Sunday Thought

Our Gospel this weekend is the familiar story of Jesus calming the storm on the Sea of Galilee. The Evangelist Mark tells us that after Jesus calmed the seas the apostles were “filled with great awe and said to one another, ‘who then is this that even the wind and sea obey him’.” Jesus’ action demands an act of faith. We are to affirm that God is one who can take care of us when we are in danger, and the God of all creation. At times, we may not have enough respect for the mystery of God. Our culture tries to convince us that there is nothing that with time we cannot figure out ourselves. This goes even for God. Yet we will never figure God out. He is always far beyond our human comprehension and understanding. However, if we submit to him in faith who knows what wonders God will work even for us.

God has no sinister plot to test our faith or trip us up. Rather, the unconditional, restorative, and rejuvenating power of God's love can bring light out of the greatest darkness and gives hope in the midst of deep despair. We have to be patient and ride out the storm. It is our task to deepen our faith that God will calm the wind and draw meaning out of that which seems senseless.
