Family Perspective

The healing of the woman and the child in today's gospel is a reminder we are all wounded. We retreat to those we love looking for acceptance, listening, understanding and support. Families must be healing communities where Jesus is present in our care for one another.

Sunday Thought

In our Gospel reading for this weekend we find Jesus healing a sick woman and raising a little girl from the dead. How can we hope to imitate Jesus in this regards? One way we can do so is by sharing what we possess with those who lack life sustaining resources. Our acts of sharing our financial and material resources can help those living in inhuman conditions to experience new life. That is what St. Paul urges us to do in our second reading for this Sunday. He reminds us that it is simply a matter of fairly balancing our present abundance and their need. He is not asking us to empty our bank accounts, sell all of our possessions, or give up our homes; that kind of radical response can be expected by only a very few followers of Jesus. No, we are asked only to share a part of our resources. Today we are often reminded that we cannot have too much money to meet our real or imagined needs.

A Christian stands counter cultural to that belief. If others do not have what they need, and we have too much of what could help them, then in order to be like Christ, we are to share from our abundance.

On the Lighter Side

So finally, she got up and started to walk down the aisle to take the baby into the cry room. The priest stopped his preaching, and very compassionately called out to the mother, "That's OK!
